OVERVIEW

HISTORY

Kaka'ako has a rich history rooted in industry, entrepreneurship, and Hawaiian culture. Once a thriving fishing village prized for the access and availability of salt. In the 1800s, kaka'ako began transitioning into an industrial and residential hub.

Today, this neighborhood continues to see improvements led by the "Our Kaka'ako" residential and commercial

project, a \$60 million project focused on redeveloping properties for residential and commercial space. In addition, the Howard Hughes Corporation is revitalizing Ward village with plans to increase walkability, add green space, and provide more restaurants, shops, shows, and more!

- 1. Moku Kitchen | 660 Ala Moana Blvd
 Bringing Hawaii's rich upcountry farming and
 ranching heritage to downtown Honolulu's urban
 lifestyle. Outdoor seating, live-music, good food.
- 2. **Highway Inn | 680 Ala Moana Blvd**Authentic Hawaiian Food and contemporary dishes.
 If you want local, this is the go-to place.
- 3. **Piggy Smalls | 1200 Ala Moana Blvd**Vietnamese dishes with a modern twist. The menu changes often, but the vegan pho is a staple.

1. Ward Village

Restaurants, a Movie theater, and over 18 shops in the South Shore Market. Ward Village is the shopping hotspot of kaka'ako.



2. Ala Moana Center

Not technically in kaka'ako, but close enough! Ala Moana is the largest open air shopping center in the nation, with over 300 retail stores, restaurants, and entertainment venues.



3. **SALT**

As the newest Shopping Center, SALT is a trendy and hip location with, boutique stores, restaurants, and coffee shops. SALT was designed to revitalize the neighborhood, and it worked. Be sure to check out the weekly farmers market

WHERE ARE THE BEST PARKS IN KAKA'AKO?

Surrounded by water, kaka'ako is near some of the nicest beach and parks in all of Hawaii.

1. Ala Moana Regional Park Ala Moana Park is a massive park with

grilling stations, tennis courts, concession stands, running tracks, exercise equipment, lagoons, and beaches. Ala Moana Park is the best beach/park around.

2. kaka'ako Waterfront Park

The Waterfront Park is a large grassy park where concerts and block parties are often hosted. There is great surfing spot here and plenty of places to relax and watch the sunset.

3. Kewalo Basin Park

Most well known as a boat harbor, Kewalo has a number of businesses, including whale watching tours, deep-sea finish, mai-tai cruises, and more.



REAL ESTATE

kaka'ako is by far the most modern and newly developed neighborhood in Honolulu. With more than 20 new sky-rise condominiums from high end developers like Howard Hughes to small local firms, developers are racing to construct luxury high-end towers.

Small studios and one-bed units typically start at \$500K, while a large four-bed penthouse can cost as much as \$30M. The average price, however, is around \$900K for a two-bed apartment. Pricing factors include floor height, proximity to Ala Moana, amenities, and view.



Finding a condo that checks all the right boxes can take time, but kaka'akois a great place to start. It has all the features of modern living, and will continue growing as Honolulu's leading neighborhood.
